If Chris Berman, legendary ESPN announcer, was broadcasting last Friday night from Centerville Stadium, he would have used his popular line, “Rumblin, Bumblin, Stumblin,” to describe Cameron Gay’s 84 yard pick-six. Usually saved for when a larger player, normally a lineman, runs with the ball, Berman uses this phrase to showcase that not all football players are as graceful and fast as you’d think.

The first thought that ran through Cam’s mind was, “Just drop, but then I saw Reggie (Powers), point to the goal,” Cam recalls. “Then the M.O.C. came out in me to Just Go, so I did. I heard the A.J. Hawk’s in my ear saying, Just Go!” In that instant the Centerville football tradition was top of mind. According to Cam, “The ancestors were shouting in my head, Just Go, Just Go, so I went. You know, the tradition.” The celebration in the end zone with Cam and his teammates (above) was awesome! Cameron Gay’s touchdown put the Elks up 20 –0 and helped to secure a 48-14 victory as Centerville’s record improved to 2-0.

The Centerville Black Shirts played another great game on defense holding the Rocks to a total of 131 yards, 117 passing yards and only 20 yards rushing. Hats off to a tremendous effort by the players, the scout team, and the coaches! Matt Karpinsky led with 7 tackles.

The offensive numbers skyrocketed from week 1 to week 2. Leading the way was running back Emable Wakilongo with 173 yards, and three touchdowns. Quarterback Drake Wells threw for 160 yards, completing 17 of 23 tosses, and one touchdown pass to Sean Cole. Nic Bruder continued his impressive work on special teams. His 42 yard punt return in the 4th quarter was spectacular!

This Friday night, the Elks welcome the Lions from Gahanna Lincoln High School. This will be a rematch from last season’s close match up in Columbus. In a back and forth battle, the Elks lost a tough one, 24-26 as the clock expired.

Statistically speaking the game was as close as the final score. First downs, passing yards, rushing attempts, redzone conversions and time of possession were within single digits of each other. The Elks offense put up 266 total yards on 216 passing yards, however only 50 yards on the ground.

The Lions quarterback, Maxwell Cummings, is a returning Senior and is one the best players in the state. He poses a tremendous challenge for the Black Shirts Friday night.

We need a huge turn-out to help the Elks get to 3-0! **GO ELKS beat the LIONS!!**

What were your top take-aways from the Coffman victory?

We took a step forward from week 1 to week 2. We improved on defense, offense, and special teams. We still have many things that we need to work on, but it was good to see our players and coaches attack the week and improve and that showed on Friday.

What was going through your mind as Cameron Gay was running his pick-6 toward the endzone?

I couldn't be happier for that young man to make that play. He comes to work every day and has battled through adversity for his team. It was a huge play in the game and stuffed a scoring-opportunity for Dublin. Even more impressive was that it was a total-team effort. Guys were getting off the ball hard and putting pressure on the quarterback. The coverage kept the quarterback from finding an open receiver. And there were teammates ushering the ball into the endzone so that Dublin couldn't make a tackle. That play was not a fluke, but rather a result of how those guys practice and play together. We need to keep getting better at playing as a team, but it was great for them to see that type of play happen when everyone does their job.

What's been a strength you've been able to rely on in your last two games?

That's an easy question to answer. The players and the assistant coaches. They show up to work every day. You ask more of them and they respond. You ask them to handle adversity and they respond. You ask them to uphold the tradition and they respond. The players and the assistant coaches deserve the credit for our successes. We have many support groups from parents to administration, and for them we are forever-grateful, but these players and assistant coaches do an incredible job and are a massive part of us winning our first two games. There's no doubt about that.

Last year the Elks played Gahanna Lincoln in a fierce battle. How do you manage that emotion and does that experience help you prepare for the rematch?

We love that we have a very diverse pre-conference schedule. We schedule great teams that have great coaches and players. This is done intentionally. It's like playing a playoff game at the beginning of your season. Our players know what happened last year. They don't need to be reminded. We are 100% focused on getting better each day. We must continue to improve. We don't control the past and we don't control the other team. We control our Humility, Effort, Attitude, Team, and Tradition so that will continue to be where we keep our focus.

Who are the Lions top players and what do the Elks need to do to stop them?

Gahanna-Lincoln has a very nice team. There is a tremendous amount of talent on the field for them. We have a great respect for the type of football they play. They play fast, strong, violent, and together. Their offense is capable of scoring points and their defense is capable of getting a lot of stops. On defense, they have a couple key players, #5 and #40 that join the others in flying around making a lot of plays. They play as a team and for us to stop them and beat them we are going to have to play as a team as well. It will be a hard-fought, physical football game. We are incredibly grateful for this opportunity.



Defense, big first half carry Centerville

CENTERVILLE — Brent Ultery sat in the Centerville coaches' room eating victory pizza with his staff.

"Don't you want to talk to my DC?" he said.

That would be defensive coordinator John Puckett, former head coach at Vandalia Butler. Ultery asked the question because Puckett's crew is off to a dominant start this season. The defense held Dublin Coffman to 182 yards and returned an interception for a touchdown Friday to lead the unbeaten Elks to a 48-14 victory.

"Our defense is awesome," Ultery said. "They play the way they play because they practice the way they practice. They practice with intentionality and speed and violence. And then a game is just another day for them because they practice so well."

Linebackers Joseph Jean-Louis and Matt Karpinsky and lineman Cameron Gay led the charge up front against Coffman (1-1) to combine for half of the team's 10 tackles for loss. And defensive backs

Emmanuel Deng, Reggie Powers and Nic Bruder led the effort in the secondary. Last week the defense held Lakota East to 151 yards in a 9-6 victory.

"We don't ever stop," Jean-Louis said. "We don't

take plays off. That doesn't happen for us. Every rep you come with your best."

The most exciting play came in the second quarter when Coffman quarterback Quinn Hart had a pass slip out of his hand

into the hands of a surprised Gay, who ran 80 yards for a touchdown on the play all defensive linemen dream about but seldom make.

"We play strong together, and I just happened to be there," said Gay, a 250-pound senior. "I almost fell down but my teammate (Powers) was there holding me up. I've never run that fast."

Centerville's offense came to play, too, against a defense that features Will Smith Jr., an Ohio State commitment and the son of former Buckeye great Will Smith. A week after stumbling around a bit the Elks built a 27-0 half-time lead.

After Coffman cut the lead to 27-14 in the third quarter, the Elks broke it open again in the fourth on touchdown runs of 58 and 30 yards by senior Emable Wakilongo. He finished with 173 yards on 23 carries and three touchdowns.

Junior quarterback Drake Wells, starting his second game, completed 17 of 23 passes for 160 yards and a 21-yard touchdown to Sean Cole to close the first half.

"What we're trying to do right now is figure out our identity," Ultery said. "What kind of passer he is, what kind of runner he is. But he does a great job, he's super coachable, has a great attitude, gives great effort. He did a good job making that jump from week one."

Special teams got into the big-play act, too. Bruder, who caught three passes, put the Elks in good field position with a combined 157 yards in kickoff and punt returns. And he capped the night with a 42-yard punt return for a touchdown.

The Elks are 2-0 and host Gahanna Lincoln (2-0) this week. One more chance to get the defense ready for GWOC play and sharpen the offensive identity.

Beavercreek tops Franklin, snaps 12-game losing streak

Beavercreek snapped a 12-game losing streak with a 20-13 victory on the road against Franklin on Friday night.

It marked the first win since Oct. 30, 2020 for the Beavers.

C.J. Crawford had a rushing touchdown and Shaun Morse drilled a 42-yard field goal in the second half to put away the victory. Brock Childers threw two touchdowns for Franklin.

Fairmont 38, Trotwood 14: Drew Baker racked up 172 yards on 30 carries with four touchdowns to lead Fairmont. Dylan Kreiger added a rushing touchdown and Will Holt drilled a 29-yard

field goal. Trotwood was paced by Timothy Carpenter who tossed a touchdown to Quinten Johnson and ran for another.

Northmont 56, Richmond 0: Javien Brownlee got Northmont started quickly with a 40-yard touchdown run. Noah McClure rumbled for two more TDs and Deuce Cortner hit D.J. Lamb on a pair of scoring throws to help the Bolts travel home from Indiana with a win.

Springboro 27, Withrow 21: Evan Ruzzo tossed a pair of touchdowns and ran for a third, throwing for 128 yards and scrambling for 217 on the ground to pace Springboro. Willizhuan Yates added 13 carries for 101 yards with a TD run and TD catch. Springboro jumped ahead 27-0 in

the first half and held off a Withrow rally to get the win.

Wayne 53, Reynoldsburg 7: Zachariah Williams and Isaiah Thompson each eclipsed the century mark on the ground, with Williams scoring three touchdowns and Thompson running for two. Tyrell Lewis added two touchdown passes and finished with 298 yards.

Tippecanoe 34, Sidney 20: Xavier Jones scampered for 105 yards with two touchdowns to lead a Tippecanoe second-half rally. Liam Poronsky connected with Evan Liette on a TD pass and ran in another score for Tipp. Tucker Herron passed for a pair of touchdowns for Sidney.

Stebbins 42, Greenville 21: Adrian Norton passed for

three touchdowns, each to Rayvonn Harris-Belle, and ran in two more to pace Stebbins. Damir Dewberry added 178 rushing yards with a TD run. Brock Short scored all three touchdowns for Greenville.

Butler 35, Fairborn 21: Luke Seibert doled out touchdown passes to Austin Flohre and Tayven Crump and added a rushing score to lead Butler. J.T. Smith had a passing and a rushing TD for Fairborn.

Piqua 58, West Carrollton 0: Brady Ouhl threw four touchdown passes, three to Ryan Brown, and Andrew Miller ran for 124 yards to lead Piqua.

Brookville 46, Anna 14: Tim Davis rumbled for 198 yards with three touch-

downs and Kory Davis hauled in a pair of touchdowns from Keegan Mehr and had an interception return for a score to lead Brookville.

Northridge 33, Oakwood 14: Ta'Ron Hill and Jeremy Henry recorded two touchdown runs apiece and Jayden Kelly added one rushing TD. Max Parker accounted for both scores for Oakwood.

Milton-Union 24, Valley View 14: Michael Elam ran for two touchdowns and caught another off a Nate Morter throw for Milton-Union. Caden Henson threw two touchdowns for Valley View.

Greeneview 38, Waynesville 35: Cole DeHaven scrambled into the end zone

from one yard out with 22 seconds to play to put Greeneview ahead. DeHaven finished 6-of-12 through the air for 111 yards with a touchdown to go with 123 yards scrambling and two TDs.

St. Marys 21, Defiance 6: St. Marys opened Western Buckeye League play with a win thanks in part to a two-touchdown night from Aiden Hinkle.






